One of the Brading Town's claims to fame is said to be that the boards used in churches all over the world to display hymn numbers were invented here by the Rev Legh Richmond, who was curate-in-charge of Brading and Yaverland 1757 to 1805, and a famous writer of inspirational evangelist pamphlets at that time.

Charles Kingley who lived 1819-1875 and is remembered as the Rector of Eversley, stayed in Shanklin in 1846 to recuperate from influenza. He also spent time with the Tennyson's at Farringford.

Knight, James Henry (1831-1910) was a teacher and education inspector. Born at Cowes, Isle of Wight he taught at Dunsford and Millbrook. In 1871, appointed Public School Inspector for East Victoria. This post he held for over 39 years. He was treasurer, Upper Canada Bible Society and head of the C. of E. Temperance Society as well as President Children's Aid Society. As an organist, choir-leader, and hymn-writer he wrote four of the hymns in the Anglican Hymnal.

1844 John Samuel Norris, American Methodist clergyman, was born in West Cowes, Isle of Wight, England. Norris was educated in Canada, where he was also ordained in 1868. He served churches for ten years in Canada, New York and Wisconsin. In 1878 he became a Congregational Minister and held pastorates in Wisconsin (1878-1882) and Iowa (1882-1901). He wrote more than 100 hymns, including *I Can Hear My Saviour Calling* and *Where He Leads Me I Will Follow*. He died 23rd September 1907 at Chicago, Illinois.
